

## **DETAILS OF INCIDENT**

# **Maritime Zone E Boarding-Nigeria**

The Denmark flag tanker vessel Nord Stingray reported an attempted boarding in the Secure Anchorage Area, Lagos, Nigeria at 0050 UTC on 25 January 2020. The incident took place at 06°17′N 003°19′E. The vessel was boarded while at anchor. The crew observed a man near the bridge and immediately sounded the alarm. Upon hearing the alarm, the perpetrator jumped over the side and then boarded a small canoe. The Lagos Secure Anchorage operations centre was notified and a patrol boat arrived immediately at the scene. Nothing was reported stolen.

#### Theft - Nigeria

The Panama flag offshore supply vessel POSH KITTYWAKE was boarded at Onne port, Nigeria at 0300 UTC on 29 January 2020. Two perpetrators approached the berthed vessel in a single small craft. One of them boarded the vessel and steal some items on the deck. Alarm was raised, perpetrator jump over and escaped with their canon.

#### **Maritime Zone D**

#### **Kidnapped - Cameroon**

A local passenger craft was attacked by armed men offshore of Limbe, Cameroon at 1040 UTC on 30 January 2020. The incident took place at: 03:58N 009:08E The local passenger craft was attacked by a speedboat carrying six-seven men. One passenger was reportedly Kidnapped. Local authorities were alerted.

## GENERAL COMMENTS

- The MMCC Zone F believes that the current poor visibility due to the harmatthan and associated calm sea state will continue to provide good conditions for pirates to exploit and attack vessels further offshore.
- The Centre also believes that the perpetrators of both crimes are linked and are poised to attack any vulnerable vessel. Vessels sailing offshore are cautioned to remain vigilant at all
- times and report any suspicious skiff sighted.
- Additionally, maritime law enforcement agencies should be ready to respond at very short notice to situation.

### FORCAST FOR THE COMING WEEK AND ADVISORIES

General Maritime Security Situation in the Maritime Zone F - Expected to remain quiet and incident free however the possibility of Petty Theft and Armed Robberies within Ports and anchorages in maritime Zone F remains likely

- Maritime Zone E and D are expected to be relatively safe. Kidnappings, Firing Upon and Armed Robberies are likely at anchorages and at sea.
- Maritime Zone A and G are expected to remain incident free.


#### **ADVISORIES**

- Merchant vessels sailing about 50 nm from the coast are likely to encounter artisanal and trawling fishing by night vessels.
- Vessels sailing in the proximity of the Jubilee Oil Fields are to remain at least 8 nm from the oil platforms to avoid being confronted /challenged by security escort vessel within the area.
- Mariners are cautioned to be on the alert at all times and report any suspicious activity to MMCC Zone F for immediate assistance.
- Ships at anchorages and ports are to maintain sufficient duty watch especially from 2200 hours 0400 hours and ships at anchorages to be extra vigilant.

## **NOTICES**

Oil Fields. All vessels transiting close to the oilfields are to observe the promulgated maritime safety and security zones around the oil fields.

West African Gas Pipeline. The West African Gas pipeline extends from Takoradi in Ghana to Nigeria. The pipeline since its installation has experienced periodic breakages due to fishing and anchoring activities on the pipeline. The position of the pipeline is shown on maritime charts. All vessels transiting the coastal areas between Ghana and Nigeria are to avoid anchoring and fishing within the pipeline protective zone.





### **DEFINITION OF TERMS**

#### PIRACY

- (A) Any illegal acts of Violence or Detention, or any act of Depredation, committed for private ends by the crew or the passengers of a private ship or a private aircraft, and directed: (i) on the High Seas, against another Ship or Aircraft, or against persons or property on board such ship or aircraft. (ii) against a ship, aircraft, persons or property in a place outside the jurisdiction of any State.
- (B) Any act of voluntary participation in the operation of a ship or of an aircraft with knowledge of facts making it a pirate ship or aircraft.
- (C) Any act of inciting or of intentionally facilitating an act described in subparagraph (a) or (b).

#### • ARMED ROBBERY AT SEA

Any unlawful act of Violence or Detention, or any act of Depredation or Threat other than an act of Piracy, directed against a Ship or against Persons or Property onboard such Ships, within a States jurisdiction over such offences.

- **HIJACK**: Vessels taken by attacker, no longer under the control of the master.
- **FIRED UPON/ATTACK**: Use of weapon by assailants at vessel or boarding with intent to take control of the vessel.
- **BOARDING**: Unauthorized boarding of a vessel by persons not part of its complement without taken control of the vessel.
- **ROBBERY**: Theft realize in territorial waters with threat or violence to crew.
- **THEFT**: Theft realize in territorial waters with no violence.

#### • ILLEGAL UNREPORTED UNREGULATED FISHING.

Illegal fishing conducted by national or foreign vessels in contravention of laws and regulations. Fishing conducted by vessels flying the flag of States that are parties to a regional fisheries management organization but operate in contravention of the conservation and management measures. Fishing in violation of national laws or international obligations. Fishing activities which have not been reported, or have been misreported. Fishing in the area of application of a regional fisheries management organization that are conducted by vessels without nationality. Fishing in areas or for fish stocks in relation to which there are no applicable conservation or management measures.

#### • MARITIME MIGRATION.

STOWAWAY: A person who hides on a ship, aircraft, or other vehicle 2. Someone who hides on a ship or aircraft to travel without having to pay.

• ILLICIT TRADE.

**ILLEGAL BUNKERING**: Bunkering is a term used to describe the process of filling a ship with oil (or coal). Illegal oil bunkering is a euphemism for theft.

#### • OTHER MARITIME INCIDENCES.

SUSPICIOUS APPROACH: All other unexplained activity in close proximity of an unknown vessel.

SIGHTING AND IRREGULAR ACTIVITY: All suspicious information with no proof of intent to board the vessel.
