DEFINITION OF TERMS

PIRACY

- (A) Any illegal acts of Violence or Detention, or any act of Depredation, committed for private ends by the crew or the passengers of a private ship or a private aircraft, and directed: (i) on the High Seas, against another Ship or Aircraft, or against persons or property on board such ship or aircraft. (ii) against a ship, aircraft, persons or property in a place outside the jurisdiction of any State.
- (B) Any act of voluntary participation in the operation of a ship or of an aircraft with knowledge of facts making it a pirate ship or aircraft.
- (C) Any act of inciting or of intentionally facilitating an act described in subparagraph (a) or (b).

• ARMED ROBBERY AT SEA

Any unlawful act of Violence or Detention, or any act of Depredation or Threat other than an act of Piracy, directed against a Ship or against Persons or Property onboard such Ships, within a States jurisdiction over such offences.

- **HIJACK**: Vessels taken by attacker, no longer under the control of the master.
- FIRED UPON/ATTACK: Use of weapon by assailants at vessel or boarding with intent to take control of the vessel.
- **BOARDING**: Unauthorized boarding of a vessel by persons not part of its complement without taken control of the vessel.
- **ROBBERY**: Theft realize in territorial waters with threat or violence to crew.
- **THEFT**: Theft realize in territorial waters with no violence.

• ILLEGAL UNREPORTED UNREGULATED FISHING.

Illegal fishing conducted by national or foreign vessels in contravention of laws and regulations. Fishing conducted by vessels flying the flag of States that are parties to a regional fisheries management organization but operate in contravention of the conservation and management measures. Fishing in violation of national laws or international obligations. Fishing activities which have not been reported, or have been misreported. Fishing in the area of application of a regional fisheries management organization that are conducted by vessels without nationality. Fishing in areas or for fish stocks in relation to which there are no applicable conservation or management measures.

• MARITIME MIGRATION.

STOWAWAY: A person who hides on a ship, aircraft, or other vehicle 2. Someone who hides on a ship or aircraft to travel without having to pay.

• ILLICIT TRADE.

ILLEGAL BUNKERING: Bunkering is a term used to describe the process of filling a ship with oil (or coal). Illegal oil bunkering is a euphemism for theft.

• OTHER MARITIME INCIDENCES.

SUSPICIOUS APPROACH: All other unexplained activity in close proximity of an unknown vessel.

SIGHTING AND IRREGULAR ACTIVITY: All suspicious information with no proof of intent to board the vessel.

OVERVIEW

- The general maritime safety and security situation in Maritime Zone F and the Gulf of Guinea (GoG) remained safe and secure.
- No maritime incident was recorded in Maritime Zone F within the week.
- Possible pirate attacks in coming days of in the GoG.
- Five crew kidnapped onboard ATLANTIC PRINCESS offshore Tema, Accra released.


DETAILS OF INCIDENT

POSSIBLE PIRATE ATTACKS IN COMING DAYS OF ZONE E AND ZONE F.

Information received from partners indicates a deep offshore pirate action group set sail to sea from the Niger Delta Region, Nigeria on 27 June 2021 preparing to attack vessels transiting the Region.

The threat of pirate attacks against shipping in the coming days (24 –72 hours) deep offshore is very high.

DETAILS OF INCIDENT

CREW KIDNAPPED ONBOARD ATLANTIC PRINCESS RELEASED.

Recall the Ghanaian registered Tuna-fishing vessel ATLANTIC PRINCESS (IMO: 8124412) was attacked and five crew members kidnapped approximately 66NM South of Tema, Ghana on 19 May 2021 at about 1830 UTC.

Updates

Information available indicates that the five crew members were released on Monday 28 June 2021 (after 40 days in captivity) following successful negotiation and payment of undisclosed ransom. All crew members are reported to be safe and in good health condition. The Ghanaian High Commission in Nigeria is facilitating documentation processes for the successful repatriation of the crew to Ghana. The crew are expected to arrive in Ghana on Tuesday 6 July 2021.

However, the five crew kidnapped onboard FV IRIS S on 31 May 2021 are still in the custody of the pirates. They have so far spent 30 days in captivity and are also expected to be released in the coming days.

GENERAL COMMENTS/ADVISORIES

- The week has been relatively calm with no incidents recorded. The last incident offshore was attempted
- ➤ boarding against CP TIANJIN about 207nm south of Cotonou, Benin on 6 June 2021 at 1700 UTC (25days ago).
- ➤ However, the threat of piracy attacks against ships remains high within the GoG given that a deep offshore pirate action group set sail to sea on 27 June 2021 preparing to attack vessels transiting the Region.
- ➤ □ Vessels making arrangements for escort services are advised to ensure proper coordination with coastal authorities to prevent gaps in arrival times which pirates usually exploit to attack vessels.
- The release of the five crew in good health and condition is a welcome news. The crew were in pirate custody for 40 days. This follows the observed trend where kidnapped crew are released between 30-40 days duration.

GENERAL COMMENTS/ADVISORIES


- ➤ □ However, with the release of the five crew and leaving only five in pirate's custody, the pirate action groups are likely to carry out more operations in the coming days to kidnap new crew for ransom as indicated in pirate action group that set sail to sea to attack vessels.
- Coastal law enforcement agencies as well as international partners (foreign naval vessels operating in GoG) are encouraged to increase surveillance and patrols within the GoG to deter pirate attacks or enable quick response in case of pirates attack.
- All vessels transiting the GoG are advised to be extra vigilant, maintain sharp lookout especially at night, observe anti-piracy measures contained in the BMP 5 and report any suspicious activities to the necessary authorities.

FORCAST FOR THE COMING WEEK

FORECAST

- Maritime Zone F is expected to be relatively safe. However pirate attacks is likely.
- Maritime Zone E and D are expected to be relatively safe. However pirate attacks is more likely.
- Maritime Zone A and G are expected to remain relatively safe. However petty theft and robberies within ports and anchorages are likely.
- Attacks against fishing vessels in the coming days are likely.


NOTICES

Oil Fields

• All vessels transiting close to the oilfields are to observe the promulgated maritime safety and security zones around the oil fields.

West African Gas Pipeline

- The West African Gas pipeline extends from Takoradi in Ghana to Nigeria. The pipeline since its installation has experienced periodic breakages due to fishing and anchoring activities on the pipeline.
- The position of the pipeline is shown on maritime charts.
- All vessels transiting the coastal areas between Ghana and Nigeria are to avoid anchoring and fishing within the pipeline protective zone.
