DEFINITION OF TERMS

PIRACY

- (A) Any illegal acts of Violence or Detention, or any act of Depredation, committed for private ends by the crew or the passengers of a private ship or a private aircraft, and directed: (i) on the High Seas, against another Ship or Aircraft, or against persons or property on board such ship or aircraft. (ii) against a ship, aircraft, persons or property in a place outside the jurisdiction of any State.
- (B) Any act of voluntary participation in the operation of a ship or of an aircraft with knowledge of facts making it a pirate ship or aircraft.
- (C) Any act of inciting or of intentionally facilitating an act described in subparagraph (a) or (b).

• ARMED ROBBERY AT SEA

Any unlawful act of Violence or Detention, or any act of Depredation or Threat other than an act of Piracy, directed against a Ship or against Persons or Property onboard such Ships, within a States jurisdiction over such offences.

- **HIJACK**: Vessels taken by attacker, no longer under the control of the master.
- FIRED UPON/ATTACK: Use of weapon by assailants at vessel or boarding with intent to take control of the vessel.
- **BOARDING**: Unauthorized boarding of a vessel by persons not part of its complement without taken control of the vessel.
- **ROBBERY**: Theft realize in territorial waters with threat or violence to crew.
- **THEFT**: Theft realize in territorial waters with no violence.

• ILLEGAL UNREPORTED UNREGULATED FISHING.

Illegal fishing conducted by national or foreign vessels in contravention of laws and regulations. Fishing conducted by vessels flying the flag of States that are parties to a regional fisheries management organization but operate in contravention of the conservation and management measures. Fishing in violation of national laws or international obligations. Fishing activities which have not been reported, or have been misreported. Fishing in the area of application of a regional fisheries management organization that are conducted by vessels without nationality. Fishing in areas or for fish stocks in relation to which there are no applicable conservation or management measures.

• MARITIME MIGRATION.

STOWAWAY: A person who hides on a ship, aircraft, or other vehicle 2. Someone who hides on a ship or aircraft to travel without having to pay.

• ILLICIT TRADE.

ILLEGAL BUNKERING: Bunkering is a term used to describe the process of filling a ship with oil (or coal). Illegal oil bunkering is a euphemism for theft.

• OTHER MARITIME INCIDENCES.

SUSPICIOUS APPROACH: All other unexplained activity in close proximity of an unknown vessel.

SIGHTING AND IRREGULAR ACTIVITY: All suspicious information with no proof of intent to board the vessel.

OVERVIEW

• The general maritime safety and security situation in Maritime Zone F and the Gulf of Guinea (GoG) remained safe and secure.

• Maritime Zone D recorded a kidnapped, Fired Upon and attempted boarding incident.

• Reported increased threat to shipping in the GoG.


DETAILS OF INCIDENT

KIDNAPPING - BIOKO SUR, MALABO, EQUATORIAL GUINEA

The Liberian flag cargo vessel MV TONSBERG was attacked about 69nm Southwest of Bioko Sur, Malabo, Equatorial Guinea about 1427 UTC on 13 December 2021.

According to the report, an unknown number of pirates fired upon the vessel whiles underway and boarded it. The Danish Naval ship HDMS ESBERN SNARE responded to the incident and proceeded to the general area. HDMS ESBERN SNARE launched her helicopter to the incident location. The helicopter located a skiff and a ladder alongside MV TONSBERG. However, the pirate action group departed before the helicopter could intervene. Six crew members were reportedly abducted and one other injured. The injured crew was evacuated onboard the Danish Frigate for treatment. The pirates were reported to be using the hostages as human shields any time the helicopter tried to intervene.

DETAILS OF INCIDENT

ATTEMPTED BOARDING - OWENDO ANCHORAGE, GABON.

An offshore supply vessel BOURBON TAMPEN was attacked at the Owendo anchorage, Gabon at about 0100 UTC on 13 December 2021.

According to the report, the crew onboard spotted some perpetrators armed with AK-47 rifles attempting to board the vessel. The alarm was raised and the crew took shelter in the citadel. The local authorities dispatched a patrol boat to the scene but the perpetrators escaped before the patrol team arrived. No casualties were recorded.




DETAILS OF INCIDENT

FIRE UPON - BATA, EQUATORIAL GUINEA

The Equatorial Guinea-flagged cargo vessel TROPICAL was attacked 10nm off Bata, Equatorial Guinea at 2130 LT (2030 UTC) on 15 December 2021.

According to the report, the vessel was attacked by an unknown number of armed perpetrators shortly after leaving Port. The security team onboard the vessel engaged in gun fire exchange with the pirates forcing them to abort the attack. One of the security personnel reportedly sustained gun shot compelling the vessel to return to Port.

Information received from multiple sources indicates increased threat to shipping for the next few days within the demarcated area with following coordinates.



The general area is about 598 square miles covering parts of Equatorial Guinea, Gabon and Sao Tome and Principe (STP). The demarcated area is about 35nm south of the location of pirate attack on MV TONSBERG on 13 December 2021.

GENERAL COMMENTS/ADVISORIES


- ➤ The week under review recorded one kidnapping and one attempted boarding incidents. There are also reports of increased threat to shipping in parts of Zones D and E.
- The threat of piracy attacks against ships therefore remains high within the GoG especially from Ghana's eastern waters to Gabon.
- All vessels transiting the GoG especially the demarcated area are advised to be extra vigilant, maintain sharp lookout especially at night and report any suspicious activities to the necessary authorities.
- Coastal law enforcement agencies and foreign navies operating in the region are encouraged to increase surveillance and patrols within the GoG to deter and arrest pirate action groups.

FORCAST FOR THE COMING WEEK

FORECAST FOR COMING WEEK

- Maritime Zone F is expected to be relatively safe. However pirate attacks is likely.
- ➤ Maritime Zone E and D are expected to be relatively safe. However pirate attacks is more likely.
- Maritime Zone A and G are expected to remain relatively safe. However petty theft and robberies within ports and anchorages are likely.
- Attacks against fishing vessels in the coming days are likely.



Oil Fields

• All vessels transiting close to the oilfields are to observe the promulgated maritime safety and security zones around the oil fields.

West African Gas Pipeline

- The West African Gas pipeline extends from Takoradi in Ghana to Nigeria. The pipeline since its installation has experienced periodic breakages due to fishing and anchoring activities on the pipeline.
- The position of the pipeline is shown on maritime charts.
- All vessels transiting the coastal areas between Ghana and Nigeria are to avoid anchoring and fishing within the pipeline protective zone.
